ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Other voting committee members include:

- (1) the Chair of the Las Cruces Courthouse Building Security Committee;
- (2) a Court of Appeals judge designated by the Chief District Judge;
- (3) the Chief Bankruptcy Judge;
- (4) the Chief Magistrate Judge;
- (5) the Chief Probation/Pretrial Officer;
- (6) the Clerk of the District Court; and
- (7) the United States Marshal.

Non-voting advisory members include:

- (1) the Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court;
- (2) a representative of the General Services Administration;

- (3) the United States Attorney (or designee);
- (4) the Federal Public Defender (or designee); and
- (5) a government-employee representative of the Federal Protective Service.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the District of New Mexico's Court Security

Committee will consist of the above listed members and will be responsible for (1) assessing the adequacy of district-wide court security; (2) ensuring the effective and efficient use of court security resources while preserving the right to a public trial; and (3) ensuring oversight of the court's emergency preparedness program.
