ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING FIRST STEP ACT

This administrative order addresses the procedures for handling counseled motions for

relief under the First Step Act, PL 115-391, and 18 U.S.C. § 3582. The First Step Act authorizes

certain offenders to seek retroactive sentencing relief, compassionate release, or a change in prison

conditions. By an Order entered September 17, 2018, the Court appointed the Office of the Public

Defender and qualified members of the Criminal Justice Act Panel to represent defendants who

may qualify for a sentence reduction under the First Step Act.

Pursuant to local custom, defense counsel is hereby directed to transmit a copy of any

motion to reduce sentence to the Office of the United States Attorney before filing it with the

Court. The parties shall confer in good faith to determine whether the defendant is entitled to relief

under the First Step Act. If the parties stipulate to relief, defense counsel shall file a joint motion

for resentencing. If the parties cannot reach an agreement, defense counsel may file a § 3582

motion to reduce sentence. Defense counsel is also reminded that any First Step Act challenges

involving the BOP's execution of a sentence must be styled as a habeas corpus petition under 28

U.S.C. § 2241.
