**AMENDED ORDER**

This order amends Miscellaneous Order Number 07-09 which was filed February 6, 2007.

Pursuant to the authority of Section U.S.C. 3563(b)(1) through (b)(10) and (b)(12) through (b)(20) Title 18 of the Federal Criminal Code and Rules, regarding terms of probation and supervised release and the mandatory and discretionary conditions of supervision,

It is ordered that the following sex offender conditions are hereby adopted and promulgated as standard sex offender conditions in the United States District Court for the District of New Mexico:

**STANDARD SEX OFFENDER CONDITIONS FOR ALL SEX OFFENSES IN THE DISTRICT OF NEW MEXICO**

1. The defendant shall comply with the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (42 U.S.C. § 16901, et seq.), as directed by the probation officer, the Bureau of Prisons, or any local, state, tribal, or federal registration agency in the jurisdiction in which he or she resides, works, or is a student. For initial registration purposes only, a sex offender shall also register in the jurisdiction in which convicted if such jurisdiction is different from the jurisdiction of residence.
2. The defendant shall waive his/her right of confidentiality and allow the treatment provider to release treatment records to the probation officer and sign all necessary releases to enable the probation officer to monitor the defendant's progress. The probation officer shall disclose the presentence report and/or any previous sex offender or mental health evaluations to the treatment provider.

3. The defendant shall submit to a search of person, property, house, residence, vehicles, documents, businesses, computers, and other electronic communications or data storage devices or media effects [as defined in 18 U. S. C. §1030(e)(1)], at any time, by a probation officer with reasonable suspicion concerning a violation of a condition of probation or supervised release, or unlawful conduct by the person, in the lawful discharge of the officer's supervision functions. The defendant shall inform any other occupants that the premises may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition. Failure to submit to a search may be grounds for revocation of supervision.
4. The defendant shall not have any direct or indirect contact or communication with the victim or his or her family, or go near or enter the premises where the victim or his or her family resides, is employed, attends school or treatment, except under circumstances approved in advance and in writing by the probation officer.
