ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The Court being fully apprised that the only mandatory Conditions of Probation or Supervised Release, to wit: not to commit another Federal, State, or local crime during the term of supervision, not to possess illegal controlled substances, and to pay a fine, restitution, or perform community service, pursuant to 18 USC 3563(a) and 18 USC 3583(d), and

The Court desiring to set forth policy and to establish uniformity in the terms and conditions of supervision for defendants placed on probation or supervised release HEREBY ADOPTS as standard Conditions of Probation and Supervised Release for the District of New Mexico the conditions of supervision recommended by the United States Sentencing Commission in policy statement 5B1.4 and Probation Form 7A promulgated by the Probation Division and the General Counsel of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that subject to amendment in individual cases as determined by the Court pursuant to 18 USC 3563(c) and 18 USC 3583(e), the following Conditions of Probation and Supervised Release shall be in effect for those defendants placed on probation or supervised release by this Court.

CONDITIONS

- (1) Defendant shall not commit another Federal, State, or local crime;
- (2) Defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the Court or Probation Officer;
- (3) Defendant shall report to the Probation Officer as directed by the Court or Probation Officer, and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month;
- (4) Defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the Probation Officer and follow the instructions of the Probation Officer;
- (5) Defendant shall support his/her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- (6) Defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the Probation Officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- (7) Defendant shall notify the Probation Officer within seventy-two hours of any change in residence or employment;
- (8) Defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any narcotic or other controlled substance, or any paraphernalia related to such substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- (9) Defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- (10) Defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity, and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the Probation Officer;
- (11) Defendant shall permit a Probation Officer to visit at any time at home or elsewhere, and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the Probation Officer;
- (12) Defendant shall notify the Probation Officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- (13) Defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the Court;


As required by law or as it may be appropriate in a particular case, the Court may imposed SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PROBATION OR SUPERVISED RELEASE including, but not limited to, those conditions suggested by the United States Sentencing Commission in Section 5B1.4(b) of the Sentencing Guidelines.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to 18 USC 3563(d) and 18 USC 3583(f), the Probation Officer shall provide each defendant placed on supervision with a written statement that sets forth all standard and special conditions of probation or supervised release to which the defendant is subject to adhere during the term of supervision.




