ORDER


THIS MATTER comes before the Court on written motion of the United States to amend its collateral forfeiture schedule for the United States National Park Service. *See* Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1); D.N.M.LR-Cr 58.1(a)(2). The Court having reviewed the motion and being fully advised in the premises, finds the motion is well taken and shall be granted.

IT FINDS that the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule provided as Exhibit 1 in the United States' motion is granted and adopted.

IT ORDERS that the United States National Park Service will apply the amount authorized to a District Court Violation Notice when a law enforcement officer elects to apply a collateral forfeiture amount.


IT FURTHER ORDERS that the collateral forfeitures authorized will remain in effect until this Court may subsequently modify them upon motion of the United States.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all previous schedules of forfeiture of collateral in lieu of appearance are superseded and cancelled as to the National Park Service.

**UNITED STATES' MOTION TO AMEND PRIOR COLLATERAL
FORFEITURE SCHEDULE**

The United States respectfully moves this Court to authorize the United States' National Park Service (NPS) to amend its collateral forfeiture amounts for specified offenses. As grounds for this motion, the United States provides the following justification:

1. **Background:**

a. The Administrative Office of the United States Courts maintains the Central Violations Bureau (CVB), which acts as a national clearinghouse for all District Court Violation Notices (citations). These citations are charging documents issued by federal law enforcement officers for Class A misdemeanor statutory and regulatory violations and below. In the interests of economy, courts may establish and "accept a fixed-sum payment in lieu of the defendant's appearance and end the case." Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1).

b. The fixed sum payment is known as a “collateral forfeiture,” which is the amount of money paid to CVB in lieu of further criminal proceedings. The payment of a collateral forfeiture is not a fine and payment is not an admission of guilt. *See* D.N.M.LR-Cr. 58.1(a)(4). A defendant who has the option to pay a collateral forfeiture may forego that right and proceed to trial. Some offenses do not have a collateral forfeiture approved and, for those offenses, a defendant is required to appear for Petty Arraignment before a magistrate judge as a “mandatory appearance.” These mandatory appearances are appropriate for a defendant charged with a misdemeanor offense for which the government continues to have a concern for the safety or welfare of the community or victim, the defendant is a recidivist, or the defendant is facing a mandatory minimum period of imprisonment for the offense.

c. A collateral forfeiture is requested by the agency through motion of the United States. The Chief United States District Court Judge has the authority to grant the collateral forfeiture. *See* D.N.M.LR-Cr 58.1(a)(2). The amount requested as the collateral forfeiture may not be greater than the amount permitted by law. *See* 18 U.S.C. § 3571. The United States assesses the requested amount to ensure amounts for similar offenses are consistent across agencies that enforce similar crimes. If this motion were approved, federal law enforcement

officers may not increase or decrease the amount of money for an applicable offense from what has been authorized.


2. **Authority.** The United States National Park Service is authorized to investigate and enforce federal postal laws, including misdemeanor offenses. CVB has assigned CVB Locator Codes to the agency in order to enable it to issue misdemeanor citations.

3. **Request.** The United States respectfully moves this Court to approve the collateral forfeiture schedule in Exhibit 1 (Collateral Forfeiture Schedule), which will permit defendants who receive NPS citations for alleged violations of misdemeanor law the option to pay a Court-approved collateral forfeiture in lieu of further criminal proceedings. This request amends and supersedes all prior schedules, the last of which was approved in Misc. No. 1426 on December 30, 1997.

4. **Point of Contact.** Should this motion be approved Supervisory AUSA Jack Burkhead, of the Violent and Community Crimes Section at the United States Attorney's Office (USAO), who may be reached at (505) 346-7274, will serve as the general point of contact for the USAO with regard to all NPS CVB matters.

- (b) Use of horses/pack animals on a park road (except for trail crossings, private property, lack of alternative routes, or on roads closed to motor vehicles) 50
- (d) Free-trailing/loose-herding horses/pack animals other than as necessary for crossing steep rock passes or where exposure is great and there is danger of animals falling off the trail (*Supt. Compendium*) 100

- (e) Failing to slow horse/pack animal to a slow walk when passing pedestrians or bicycles 100
